#### Where found

Forest, talus slopes, damp crevices, and gullies, usually near waterfalls. Blue Mountains and Wollemi National Parks.

#### **Notes**

Shrub to 2 m high. Hairless. Leaves opposite each other or in whorls of 3-4, mostly 3-10 cm long, 10-45 mm wide, strongly veined, margins toothed, upper surface green and hairless, lower surface more or less glaucous, often with a reddish tinge and sparsely hairy. Flowers white tinged pink, with 5 petals each 3-4 mm long. Flowers in more or less stalkless heads. Flowers November-
