### Common name

Mountain baeckea

### Family

Myrtaceae

## Where found

Moist places in **forest** and **heath**, wet rocky sites, mountain gullies, margins of swamps and along streams, and in bogs. Mainly ranges, tablelands, ACT, the mountains to the west, and Kosciuszko National Park. Occasionally elsewhere.

### Notes

Shrub to 3 m tall. Leaves aromatic when rubbed, opposite each other, 0.3-1 cm long, 1-3 mm wide, more or less triangular in cross section, keeled below. Flowers with 5 white petals, 4-7 mm in diameter. Flowers single, appearing clustered. Flowers Summer to Autumn.

All native plants on unleased land in the ACT are protected.
