# **Plants of South Eastern New South Wales**

### Common name

None

### Family

Fabaceae

## Where found

Open forest and woodland. Mainly in the Sydney area east from between Picton and Richmond. Two records from the tablelands south of Goulburn.

#### Notes

Shrub ot 0.2 m tall, prostrate to sprawing. Branchlets slightly to moderately compressed, moderately hairy, often waxy. Leaves alternating along the stems, 0.2-1.2 cm long, 2-6 mm wide, margins flat or slightly curved down, upper surface smooth, with gland-dotting usually evident, and hairy with appressed hairs or becoming hairless; lower surface becoming hairless; tips broadly rounded to blunt, or occasionally pointed. Stipules become brown with age. Flowers pea-shaped, with 5 petals, 2 joined together to form the keel. Standard petal to about 9 mm long, yellow with a red flare on the inside, entirely red on the outside. Wings brownish red throughout or almost so. Keel pale, red in the lower half. Flowers Winter to Spring.
