Common name

Broad-leaved sally, Mountain swamp gum

Family

Myrtaceae

Where found

Scattered on open swampy flats. In and near Penrose and Wingello State Forests west of Bundanoon.

Notes

Tree or **mallee** to 7 m tall. Bark smooth, shedding in long ribbons. **Juvenile** leaves **alternating** up the stems, glossy green. **Adult** leaves 5-10 cm long, 20-40 mm wide, green or **glaucous**, dull. Flowers white, with 0 **petals**. Flowers in 7-flowered clusters. Mature flower buds 8 mm long, caps as long as the base. Gumnuts 4-7 mm in diameter. Gumnuts that have dropped their seed have protruding **valves**.

Vulnerable Australia. Vulnerable NSW. Provisions of the Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016 No 63 relating to the protection of protected plants generally also apply to plants that are a threatened species.
