# **Plants of South Eastern New South Wales**

### Common name

A goodenia

### **Family**

Goodeniaceae

#### Where found

Damp south-facing sandstone cliffs. Blue Mountains.

## **Notes**

Shrub to about 0.6 m high. Stems hairless. Leaves alternating up the stems, 3.5–7 cm long, 8–20 mm wide, margins toothed. Flowers yellow, 14–18 mm long, yellow, tubular, the tube split to the base, with 5 lobes, 2-lipped. Flowers on stalks to 50 mm long, in elongated or branched clusters. Flowering: October–April. Seeds elliptic, 1.5–1.7 mm long, brown, glossy..
