Common name

Wingello grevillea

Family

Proteaceae

Where found

Dry forest, woodland, and heath in seasonally wet sites on sandstone shelves. Tallong-Wingello area, ENE of Goulburn.

Notes

Shrub to 1 m high. Leaf tips usually sharp. Leaves alternating up the stems, 1.5–4 cm long, mostly 1–4 mm wide, upper surface smooth, lower surface appressed hairy, margins entire and angularly curved down, sometimes obscuring the lower surface apart from the midvein. Flowers with 4 'petals' joined together in pairs, 'petals' reddish, loosely appressed hairy outside, bearded inside. Gynoecium 19.5–21 mm long; style reddish, hairless except for short erect hairs near the tips. Flower clusters 10-12 flowered, tending to be one sided, 1.5–3 cm long. Flowering: all year.

In the absence of specific information, seeds of all species of *Grevillea* have been keyed as having one wing.

Endangered Australia. Vulnerable NSW. Provisions of the Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016 No 63 relating to the protection of protected plants generally also apply to plants that are a threatened species.
