Common name

A grevillea

Family

Proteaceae

Where found

Forest. Coastal. Ranges north from west of Kiama.

Notes

Spreading or sprawling **shrub**, mostly to 2 m high. Leaves **alternating** up the stems, 0.8–4 cm long, 2.5–18 mm wide, margins **entire**, and almost flat to rolled down, upper surface granular, lower surface hairy, sometimes sparsely so. Flowers with 4 '**petals**' joined together in pairs, '**petals**' usually green to reddish brown, hairy or sparsely hairy outside, **bearded** usually above the middle inside. **Gynoecium** 18–28 mm long, **style** red to purple, sometimes partly green, hairy. Flower clusters 6–18-flowered. Flowering: autumn to spring.

In the absence of specific information, seeds of all species of *Grevillea* have been keyed as having one **wing**.

Occasionally hybridises with *Grevillea arenaria* subsp. *arenaria*.
