## Common name

A grevillea

## Family

Proteaceae

## Where found

**Woodland** and **heath**. Coastal north of Woy Woy.

## Notes

**Shrub** to 1.2 m high. Leaves usually with sharp tips. Leaves **alternating** up the stems, mostly 1–3.5 cm long, 1.5–6 mm wide, margins bent or curved down, lower surface moderately to sparsely hairy. Flowers with 4 red '**petals**' joined together in pairs, sparsely to moderately **appressed** hairy outside, **bearded** inside. **Gynoecium** 9.5–15 mm long; **style** red, with warts and short hairs over most of its length. Flower clusters more or less pointing up, dome-shaped to almost round. Flowering: ?summer and autumn.

In the absence of specific information, seeds of all species of *Grevillea* have been keyed as having one **wing**.
