

# Plants of South Eastern New South Wales

## Common name

Genoa Grevillea

## Family

Proteaceae

## Where found

**Forest** and **woodland**, usually near streams. Ranges south from Deua National Park. Coastal at Green Cape south of Eden.

## Notes

**Shrub** to 4 m high. Branchlets hairy. New growth usually pink or purplish pink. Leaves **alternating** up the stems, 1.2–8 cm long, 4–19 mm wide, margins **entire** and curved down, upper surface smooth and dull, rarely glossy, lower surface exposed, densely hairy or occasionally slightly hairy. Flowers with 4 '**petals**' joined together in pairs, '**petals**' red outside with red hairs, densely to slightly **appressed** hairy, **bearded** inside. **Gynoeceium** 11–20 mm long; **style** red or reddish pink, mostly hairless. Flower clusters curved down or hanging down, **simple** or to 3-branched; unit clusters of 8–36 flowers. Flowers throughout the year.

In the absence of specific information, seeds of all species of *Grevillea* have been keyed as having one **wing**.

Intergrades with *Grevillea epicroca* have been recorded.
