

Common name

Shield pennywort

Family

Araliaceae

Where found

Steram banks and in freshwater swamps and lagoons, sometimes partially submerged. Sydney area. Between Tathra and west of Candelo.

Notes

Perennial herb, rhizomatous, stems creeping, rooting at the nodes. Stems hairless. Leaves single or in clusters of 2 or 3, arising from the nodes, peltate, round, 20–50 mm in diameter, margins scalloped, surfaces hairless. Flowers small, with 5 petals, creamy-yellow. Flowers in clusters of 2–5, often in interrupted spikes with 2-7 whorls. Flowering: Nov.–Apr.

Family was Apiaceae.
