

# Plants of South Eastern New South Wales

## Common name

An indigo

## Family

Fabaceae

## Where found

Usually on ridges or rocky hillsides. Tablelands and Western Slopes north of Yass.

## Notes

Spindly **shrub** to 1.5 m high. Young stems hairy. Leaves **alternating** up the stems, **compound**, 4–8.5 cm long; leaflets mostly 19–35, 0.4–1.3 cm long, 3.5–7 mm wide, tips notched. Flowers pea shaped, with 5 **petals**, 2 joined together to form the **keel**. Petals pink to deep pink. Flower clusters 5–12 cm long.
