Common name

Hairy stylewort

Family

Stylidiaceae

Where found

Woodland, heath, rocky areas, and moist sites. Kosciuszko National Park, the mountains to the north, and Western Slopes.

Notes

Ephemeral herb to 0.08 m high. Stems reddish, sticky hairy or hairy. Leaves **alternating** up the stems, 0.2–0.6 cm long, 1–3 mm wide, with **glandular** hairs. Flowers whitish with a yellowish throat, 2–3 mm long, tubular, with 4 lobes, and a short column arising from the centre of the flower. Flowers in 1–6 flowered clusters. Flowers winter–summer.
