Common name

Snow-in-summer, Flax-leaved paperbark, Budjur

Family

Myrtaceae

Where found

Dry forest, heath, grassy areas, moist areas, and stream banks. Coast, ranges, and the eastern edge of the tablelands.

Notes

Shrub or tree to 10 m tall. Bark papery. Branchlets initially hairy, soon becoming hairless. Leaves aromatic when rubbed, opposite or almost opposite each other, 1-4.5 cm long, 1-3.5 mm wide, tips pointed, surfacees hairless. Flower **heads** 15-40 mm long, many-flowered, white. Individual flowers with 5 **petals** each about 3 mm long. **Stamens** about 8-20 mm long. Flowers Spring to Summer.
