A geebung

Family

Proteaceae

Where found

Forest and heath. Ranges west from Sydney.

Notes

Shrub to 1.7 m tall, spreading to prostrate. Fruit fleshy. Bark smooth. Young branchlets moderately hairy with greyish hairs. Leaves alternating up the stems, 0.8–2.2 cm long, 2.5–8.5 mm wide, flat, with curved down margins, surfaces different colours, surfaces sparsely hairy to hairless, tips pointed. Flowers with 4 yellow 'petals' each 7–10 mm long, more or less fused at the base, hairless. Flowers erect to spreading, in 1-16 flowered clusters, the flowers mostly subtended by small leaves or leaves. Flowers Dec.–Apr.

Intergrades with *Persoonia oxycoccoides* in a limited area between Jenolan Caves and Kanangra Walls at the southern end of its distribution.
