## **Common name**

Nodding geebung

#### Family

Proteaceae

# Where found

Dry forest and woodland. Western Sydney.

## Notes

Shrub to 2.5 m high, hairs greyish, mostly appressed. Fruit fleshy. Bark smooth. Young branches sparsely to moderately hairy with greyish hairs. Leaves alternating up the stems, 1-4.5 cm long, 1-2.5 mm wide, usually flat, with curved down margins, upper surface a very different colour from the lower surface, surfaces sparsely hairy when immature, becoming hairless when mature. Flowers with 4 yellow 'petals' each 8.5–11 mm long, more or less fused at the base, hairless. Flowers drooping, on stalks 7–12 mm long, mostly subtended by leaves, in 1-40-flowered clusters. Flowering: mostly November-April.
