A Waxflower

Family

Rutaceae

Where found

Heath on rocky or sandy sites. Sydney region and north, north from Royal National Park.

Notes

Shrub to 2 m high. Branchlets rough. Leaves aromatic when rubbed, crowded, 1–2 cm long, 1–1.5 mm wide, flattened cylindrical, thick, tips pointed, surfaces prominently dotted with **glands**, and bristly to more or less hairless. Flowers pink or mauve to purple, darker below along the midline, with 5 **petals** each 10–15 mm long. Stamens with filaments fused in the basal half, the free portion of the filaments hairy. Anthers concealed by the long upwardly appressed hairs on the filaments, and with a tuft of long hairs at the tips. Flowers single or 2 or 3 together. Flowers August–December.
