Common name

Wedding bush

Family

Euphorbiaceae

Where found

Forest and heath. Coastal. Ranges mainly north from Kangaroo Valley.

Notes

Shrub to 3 m high. Stems more or less hairless. Leaves alternating up the stems, mostly 1–4 cm long, mostly 1–3 mm wide, upper surface hairless, lower surface hairless, lowers usually white, with 4-6 petals each 10–15 mm long. Flower clusters usually consisting of 1 female flower with 3–6 male flowers with the female flowers usually flowering first, or all male flowers. Sepals hairless outside, hairless outside, hairless outside. Flowers mostly winter and spring.
