

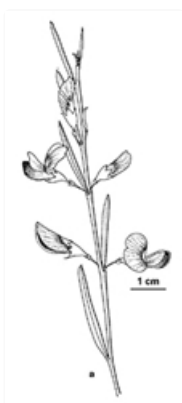

Common name

Leafy Templetonia

Family

Fabaceae

Where found

Dry **forest**, open situations, and near streams. Western Slopes.

Notes

Shrub to 0.6 m high, **erect** to **prostrate**. Stems more or less cylindrical to angular, more or less ridged, hairless. Leaves **alternating** up the stems, 1–7 cm long, 2–6 mm wide, tips with a short curved **mucro**, sometimes blunt. Flowers reddish brown and yellow, 10–12 mm long, pea shaped, with 5 **petals**, 2 joined together to form the **keel**. Flowers single or paired. Flowers: spring.
