

Leaf surface (leaves of mature crown)

Rough (scabrid and/or setose)

Leaves of the crown of some northern species of bloodwood and ghost gum have sparse to dense setae (multicellular bristle-glands) over the surface, sometimes confined to margins and main veins. These setae weather as the leaf ages and thus feel rough (scabrid) rather than hairy (e.g. *Corymbia setosa*, *C. dendromerinx*).

Smooth

Most species lack these setae and thus feel smooth.
