Description

Fronds to 64 cm long and 16 cm wide; stipe and rachis red-brown to black, glabrous or with sparse hairs (1–15 cells). Lamina ovate or triangular, 3-pinnate or 4-pinnatifid at base, 2-pinnate for most of length; larger pinnae triangular-ovate; pinnules linear, oblong, lanceolate or ovate; ultimate pinnules incised at the base and caudate at apex; margins slightly crenate; upper and lower surfaces glabrous or with sparse, short or minute hairs, often along the midrib. Spores with varying amount of echinate ornamentation, either tetrahedral, trilete, 32–48 μ m diam. and 32 per sporangium, or spherical, 51–60 μ m diam. and 16 per sporangium.

Distribution

Tropical Australia in QLD, NT and WA, possibly also in New Caledonia

Habit and habitat

Terrestrial in soil pockets and rock crevices in arid, semi-arid and monsoonal open woodland. Not usually a rainforest fern.

Similar species

Similar to C. nitida but the two can be distinguished by the following key:

1a. Fronds 2-pinnate, segments very narrow linear = Cheilanthes nitida

1b. Fronds 3–4 pinnate, segments narrow oblong to lanceolate = Cheilanthes caudata

Occasional intermediates have been reported.
