## Common name

None

## Family

Fabaceae

## Where found

Wet **shrubland** and in swamps. Restricted to the Blue Mountains.

## Notes

**Shrub** to 1 m tall or sprawling. Stems moderately to densely hairy, with hairs that point upwards or are **spreading**. Leaves **alternating** up the stems, 0.5–1 cm long, 1–2 mm wide, concave in cross section, margins not warty, leaf tips curved upwards. Flowers pea-shaped, with 5 **petals**, 2 joined together to form the **keel**, with yellow petals with red to dark markings. **Calyx** 5–5.5 mm long, **standard** petal 9–11 mm long. Flowers in clusters at the tops of the stems. **Bracteoles** below the flowers 3–5 mm long. **Bracts** below the flowers 4–6 mm long, moderately to densely hairy.
