Common name

River Rose, Dog Rose, Wiry Bauera

Family

Cunoniaceae

Where found

Moist situations in **forest** and **heath**, and stream banks. Coast, ranges, and the eastern edge of the tablelands.

Notes

Shrub to 2 m high, **scrambling**, often sprawling and tangled. Stems **wiry**. Young stems hairy. Leaves opposite each other, appearing **simple** and **whorled, compound**, with 3 leaflets each 0.3–1.5 cm long, 1.5–5 mm wide, with 4–10 teeth on each margin, tips pointed. Flowers pink, occasionally white, about 5–20 mm in diameter, with 5–8 **petals**. Flowers on stalks more than 5 mm long. Flowering: most of the year.

Family was Baueraceae.
