## Common name

Angled Pigface, Angular Pigface

# **Family**

Aizoaceae

#### Where found

Coastal. Mainly coastal dunes and coastal **shrubland**. Planted for control of erosion of sandy and sometimes saline soils, occasionally escaping.

## **Notes**

Introduced prostrate perennial herb with stems to 2 m long. Stems, leaves, and fruit fleshy. Leaves opposite each other, triangular in cross section, 3.5–9 cm long, 5–12 mm thick, dull green or **glaucous**, sometimes slightly glossy. Flowers light purple throughout, sometimes pale near the base, but not white, 35–80 mm in diameter, with about 70–150 'petals'. Fruit purple, oval to oval, distinctly 2-angled, 15–30 mm long. Flowers Sep.–Apr.
