Apiaceae

Where found

Damp places. Coast, ranges, and tablelands. Mainly in the Sydney region.

Notes

Creeping **perennial** herb, rooting at the **nodes**. Leaves in groups at the nodes, 0.5-5.5 cm long, mostly longer than broad, usually becoming hairless, margins **entire**, wavy, or faintly toothed. Leaf stalks often purplish tinted. Flowers bisexual or the **lateral** ones male, with 5 **petals** about 1.5 mm long, white to pink to crimson or purple. **Sepals** forming a minutely lobed persistent ring. Flowers in clusters of usually 2-3 flowers. Flowers late summer—autumn.
