Common name

None

Family

Lamiaceae

Where found

Forest, woodland, and disturbed sites. Ranges and tablelands north from Wadbilliga National Park. Coastal north from Jervis Bay.

Notes

Shrub to 0.9 m high, hairy. Leaves opposite each other or in **whorls** of 3, 0.5–5 cm long, 1–5 mm wide, upper surface wrinkled, lower surface white **woolly**, margins rolled down, bases continuing down the stems. Flowers greenish yellow or greenish blue to mauve, 20–45 mm long, tubular, 2-lipped, 5-lobed, the lower lobe of the lower lip hairless inside. **Stamens** and **style** projecting beyond the flower tube. Flowers single at the bases of the leaves. Flowers throughout the year but chiefly winter.

Family was Chloanthaceae.
