## **Common name**

Italian Cyress

### **Family**

Cupressaceae

### Where found

Occasionally naturalised. Coast and ranges north from the Wollongong area. Planted in Canberra. Rarely elsewhere.

#### **Notes**

Introduced tree to 30 m high. Branchlets 4-angled, usually flattened, in 2-dimensional sprays. Leaves opposite each other, scale-like, 0.05–0.2 cm long, green. Male and female **cones** on the same plant. Male cones 4–8 mm long, globular. Mature female cones almost globular, 25–40 mm long. **Cone scales** 8–14, each with 8–20 seeds. Cones single. Seeds with 2 narrow wings.
