#### Common name

A dampiera

#### **Family**

Goodeniaceae

### Where found

Forest, woodland, and heath. Coast and ranges, north from Jervis Bay and Nerriga.

## **Notes**

Shrub to 0.6 m high. Stems cylindrical, ribbed, covered with pale grey hairs. Leaves alternating up the stems, sometimes clustered, 0.9–3 cm long, I-6 mm wide, margins entire or with a few teeth, upper surface hairless, lower surface pale greyish hairy. Flowers purple to mauve inside, with fine silvery-grey hairs outside, 9–12 mm long, tubular, the tube slit on the lower side, 2-lipped, with 5 lobes. Flowering branches single or 2 together, I-3-flowered. Flowering: chiefly August–January. Seed cases 3–4 mm long, ribbed, silvery-grey hairy.
