

# Plants of South Eastern New South Wales

## Common name

Small parrot-pea

## Family

Fabaceae

## Where found

Dry **forest**. Coast and ranges north from the Clyde River.

## Notes

**Shrub** to 1 m tall. Stems hairy with minute hairs. Leaves **alternating** up the stems, 0.15-0.4 cm long, narrow, twisted spirally, tips curved and pointed, surfaces warty and hairless. Standard petal 5-7 mm long. Flowers pea shaped, with 5 **petals**, 2 joined together to form the **keel**, yellow with red markings, in 1-6 flowered clusters. Flowers most of the year.

In all species of *Dillwynia*, the **standard** petal is much broader than long.
