### Common name

A parrot-pea

### **Family**

Fabaceae

# Where found

Dry forest and woodland, and rarely on coastal headlands. Mostly north from west of Jervis Bay, sometimes farther south. Coast, ranges, and the eastern edge of the tablelands.

#### **Notes**

Prostrate to spreading shrub to 1 m tall. Stems hairy with minute hairs. Leaves alternating up the stems, 0.2-0.5 cm long, narrow, usually spirally twisted, tips curved and pointed, surfaces hairless or with wart-based hairs. Standard petal 4-6 mm long. Flowers pea shaped, with 5 petals, 2 joined together to form the keel, yellow to orange, with red or dark markings. Flowers in clusters of 1-6 flowers.

Dillwynia sp. Trichopoda (Maiden & Boorman s.n. NSW40290) in PlantNET

Full name *Dillwynia* sp. Trichopoda (J.H.Maiden & J.L. Boorman s.n.40290) NSW Herbarium.

In all species of Dillwynia, the standard petal is much broader than long.
