Plants of South Eastern New South Wales

Common name

A parrot-pea

Family

Fabaceae

Where found

Swamp heath on sandstone. Ranges and the eastern edge of the tablelands between Morton National Park west of Milton and west of Jervis Bay. Also in and near Newnes State Forest east of Lithgow.

Notes

Erect or **spreading shrub** to 0.5 m tall. Stems hairy. Leaves **alternating** up the stems, 0.7-1.5 cm long, **linear**, tips usually curved, pointed, surfaces smooth, hairless. Standard petal 8-10 mm long. . Flowers pea shaped, with 5 **petals**, 2 joined together to form the **keel**, yellow with red to dark markings. Flowers most of the year. Flowers usually paired, tightly clustered to form a globular **head**.

In all species of Dillwynia, the standard petal is much broader than long.
