A Sundew

Family

Droseraceae

Where found

Wet situations. Coast and ranges north of the Illawarra Highway. Occasionally farther south on the coast and tablelands.

Notes

Annual herb to 0.15 m high, **rhizomatous**. Leaves basal, in a flat **rosette**; 8–10 mm long, 5–6 mm wide, spoon shaped, upper surface covered with **glandular** hairs that trap insects. Flowers white or pink, with 5 **petals** each 4 mm long. **Bracts** just below the flowers divided into 3, **calyx** warty, **styles** 5, threadlike. Flowers in 1–3 clusters, each with 3–10 flowers. Flowering: Winter to Spring.
