Common name

Heronsbill

Family

Geraniaceae

Where found

Paddocks, roadsides, and disturbed sites. ACT and Western Slopes. Occasionally elsewhere.

Notes

Introduced annual herb to 0.5 m high, or sprawling. Lower stems hairy with stiff white simple hairs, shorter glandular hairs becoming predominant higher up. Leaves basal and opposite each other, 3-15 cm long, 10-40 mm wide, covered with scattered more or less stiff white hairs especially towards the margins, margins more or less lobed, and toothed. Flowers blue, with 5 petals. Sepals 4.5-10 mm long, petals slightly longer. Flowers in 1-4 flowered clusters. Flowers Jun.-Oct.
