Common name

Cliff Cudweed

Family

Asteraceae

Where found

Herbfields, rock crevices, and shaded cliff faces. Kosciuszko National Park.

Notes

Perennial herb to 0.15 m high, stoloniferous, sometimes mat-forming. Stems woolly. Basal leaves in a rosette, 1-6 cm long, 5-18 mm wide, upper surface grey with appressed white hairs or green and almost hairless, lower surface with a white-tomentum, blades with long expanded stalks. Stem leaves alternating up the stems, similar but smaller. Outer florets purple, inner florets purple or colourless. Flower heads 1.5-2.5 mm in diameter, about 4.5 mm long, in a dense globular cluster of about 7 flower heads, surrounded by several conspicuous leafy bracts. Flower heads at the tops of the stems. Smaller clusters occasionally at the base of the upper leaves. Flowering: Dec.-Mar.
