

# Plants of South Eastern New South Wales

## Common name

None

## Family

Fabaceae

## Where found

**Woodland** and **grassland**. Western Slopes. One record from Wallacia, outer Sydney. Mostly north of the area covered by this key.

## Notes

**Perennial** scrambler. Stems hairy. Leaves **alternating** along the stems, **compound**, with 3 leaflets, each 2–5.8 cm long, 10–33 mm wide, tips more or less rounded to more or less pointed, both surfaces more or less **silky**. **Standard** petal 6.5–10 mm long, Flowers pea shaped, with 5 **petals**, 2 joined together to form the **keel**, mauve to more or less red-purple, in clusters of 4-18 flowers. Flowering: Oct.–Apr.
