Common name

Woolly glycine

Family

Fabaceae

Where found

Forest, woodland, shrubland, grassy areas, and moist places. Coast and ranges. Occasionally elsewhere.

Notes

Twining or trailing **perennial** herb. Stems with fawn or golden-brown hairs. Leaves **alternating** along the stems, **compound**, with 3 leaflets, each 1-6.5 cm long, 4-35 mm wide, tips blunt to rounded or notched; surfaces **velvety** to **tomentose** or bristly, with fawn or golden-brown hairs. **Standard** petal 5-10 mm long. Flowers pea shaped, with 5 **petals**, 2 joined together to form the **keel**, pink to reddish purple, in clusters of 7-15 flowers. Flowers Spring to Autumn.
