## Common name

Daisy Goodenia

## Family

Goodeniaceae

## Where found

**Forest** and **heath**. Mainly coast, ranges, and tablelands, east of Boorowa. Occasionally elsewhere.

## Notes

**Perennial** herb to 0.6 m high. Stems hairless to **cottony** hairy. Leaves basal or towards the base of the stems, 4–10 cm long, 5–20 mm wide, tips pointed or blunt, surfaces hairy to becoming hairless, margins **entire** to toothed. Flowers orange to yellow, 10–12 mm long, tubular, the tube split to the base, 2-lipped, with 5 lobes. Flowers on stalks mostly less than 3 mm long, in branched clusters or **spikes**. Seeds round, about 1 mm in diameter, dark brown to black.
