Common name

Swamp goodenia

Family

Goodeniaceae

Where found

Damp sites in **forest**, **woodland** and **grassland**, along streams, swamp margins, and in other damp places. South of Goulburn. Coast, ranges, and tablelands.

Notes

Perennial herb to 0.20 m high, often with **adventitious roots**. Stems covered in soft hairs to hairless. Leaves mostly basal, mostly 4–10 cm long, 4–8 mm wide, thick, usually becoming hairless, tips pointed or blunt, margins toothed or **entire**. Flowers yellow, sometimes purplish in the centre of the flower, 8–12 mm long, tubular, the tube split to the base, with 5 lobes, 2-lipped. Flowers on stalks to 30 mm long, in open clusters. Flowering: chiefly November–March. Seeds yellow-brown.
