Common name

A grevillea

Family

Proteaceae

Where found

Open rocky or moist sites in dry **forest** and **woodland**. Coast, ranges, and the eastern edge of the tablelands, north of Kangaroo Valley.

Notes

Shrub to 5 m high. Leaves **alternating** up the stems, 15–25 cm long, mostly 3–20 mm wide, margins **entire** to coarsely toothed, lower surface **tomentose** with crinkled hairs. Flowers with 4 '**petals**' joined together in pairs, with greyish hairs outside, hairless inside. **Gynoecium** 12–25 mm long, **style** pinkish, with a green tip. Flower clusters one sided tooth brushes 3–8 cm long. Flowering: mainly July–November.

In the absence of specific information, seeds of all species of *Grevillea* have been keyed as having one **wing**.
