Common name

Jervis Bay grevillea

Family

Proteaceae

Where found

Open **forest**, **woodland**, **heath**, and **shrubland**. Coast, ranges, and the Southern Highlands, between the Bundanoon area and Deua National Park west of Moruya.

Notes

Shrub to 3 m high. Leaves **alternating** up the stems, 5–27 cm long, 20–120 mm wide, **simple** or (in Deua National Park) with several lobes up to 5 cm long, margins flat or slightly curved down, lower surface densely covered with curled hairs. Flowers with 4 '**petals**' joined together in pairs, '**petals**' greenish white to grey-brown, hairy outside, hairless inside. **Gynoecium** 18–29 mm long, **style** pink to red, hairless. Flower clusters one-sided tooth brushes 4–10 cm long. Flowers most of the year.

In the absence of specific information, seeds of all species of *Grevillea* have been keyed as having one **wing**.
