

Plants of South Eastern New South Wales

Common name

A grevillea

Family

Proteaceae

Where found

Dry **forest**. Ranges and Southern Highlands west of Wollongong.

Notes

Shrub to 1.5 m high. Tips of the leaf lobes spiny. Leaves **alternating** up the stems, 2.5–5 cm long, with 3–5 narrow lobes, each divided twice again, the **ultimate** lobes 0.5–2.4 cm long, 0.6–1.2 mm wide, upper surface hairless, lower surface **silky**, with two grooves. Flowers with 4 '**petals**' joined together in pairs, '**petals**' white with rusty hairs outside, hairless inside. **Gynoecium** 6–7 mm long, **style** white in the lower half, lilac in the upper half, hairless. Flowers brown in bud. Flower clusters oval, dense. Flowers spring.

In the absence of specific information, seeds of all species of *Grevillea* have been keyed as having one **wing**.
