Common name

A guinea-flower

Family

Dilleniaceae

Where found

Forest. Coast, ranges, and the eastern edge of the tablelands.

Notes

Shrub to 1 m high. Stems mostly hairless, sometimes densely hairy with **simple** hairs. Leaves **alternating** up the stems, 0.5–1.2 cm long, 2.5–5 mm wide, folded longitudinally, both surfaces generally hairless, margins flattish to curved down, mostly with some prominent teeth on the squared off tips, tips sometimes rounded. Flowers with 5 yellow **petals** each 4–6 mm long. **Stamens** 10–12, surrounding the **carpel**. Carpel usually single, hairless. Flowers single at the tips of short shoots, stalkless. Flowers Spring to Autumn.
