## Common name

Branching Grass-flag

## Family

Iridaceae

## Where found

**Forest** and moist gullies. Coast and ranges.

## Notes

**Perennial** herb. **Rhizomatous**. Hairless. Leaves basal, 20–60 cm long, 4–12 mm wide, **linear**, flat, grass-like. **Scape** cylindrical, shorter than the leaves. Flowers with 6 white '**petals**'; outer '**petals**' 6–10 mm long; inner '**petals**' 8–13 mm long. Flowers in numerous clusters, each 3–6-flowered. Flowering: September–November. Seed case black when ripe, round, 3-furrowed, 5–8 mm in diameter.
