# **Common name**

Australian trefoil, Austral trefoil

#### Family

Fabaceae

## Where found

Dry forest, woodland, and grassy areas. Sydney area, tablelands, ACT, the mountains to the west, Kosciuszko National Park, and Western Slopes. Occasional elsewhere.

## Notes

**Perennial** herb to 0.6 m tall, hairy to hairless. Leaves **alternating** up the stems, **compound**, with 5 leaflets, each 0.6-4 cm long, 1– 10 mm wide, hairy to hairless, tips pointed to blunt, basal leaflets stem-clasping. Flowers 10-22 mm long, pea shaped, with 5 **petals**, 2 joined together to form the **keel**, white, pink, or sometimes purple, in clusters of 3-8 flowers. Flowers all year, mostly in Spring.

Lotus australis var. australis in the ACT.

All native plants on unleased land in the ACT are protected.
