Common name

Cockspur thorn

Family

Moraceae

Where found

Forest and stream banks. Coast and ranges north from Milton.

Notes

Woody climber or straggling **shrub**. Fruit fleshy. '**Petals**' fleshy. Spines 5–25 mm long along the smaller stems. Young stems hairy with fine hairs, becoming hairless. Leaves **alternating** up the stems, 1–8 cm long, 15-35 mm wide, hairless, lower surface paler than upper surface, tips pointed. Male and female flowers on different plants. Flowers green to yellowish, '**petals**' about 3-3.5 mm long. Male flowers with 4 '**petals**'; female flowers with 3-4 'petals'. Flowers in globular **heads**, male heads 5-8 mm in diameter, female heads 10-12 mm in diameter. Multiple fruit yellow to orange, more or less globular, 10–20 mm in diameter.
