## Common name

Sticky daisy-bush, Hoary daisy-bush

## Family

Asteraceae

## Where found

**Forest, woodland**, heath, and moist sites. Coast, ranges, and the eastern edge of the tablelands, north from Jervis Bay.

## Notes

**Shrub** to 2 m high. Stems hairless, young growth sticky. Leaves **alternating** up the stems, scattered, 2–11.5 cm long, 5–40 mm wide, upper surface sticky and green, lower surface hairless and pale green, **venation** obvious, tips pointed or blunt or rounded, without a **mucro**; margins **entire** and weakly rolled down. Flower **heads** 11–26 mm in diameter overall, with 7–23 white '**petals**', and cream to yellow centres. Flower heads in loose branched clusters. Flowering: November–May.
