Common name

A Daisy-bush

Family

Asteraceae

Where found

Forest. Kosciuszko National Park.

Notes

Shrub to 1 m high. Leaves **alternating** up the stems, scattered, 0.7–5.5 cm long, 4–16 mm wide, tips pointed or blunt, without a **mucro**; margins **entire** or wavy and toothed or toothed, flat, upper surface loosely **stellate**-hairy (needs a hand lens or a macro app on your phone/tablet to see) and dark green, lower surface densely stellate-hairy and pale green. Flower **heads** 22–27 mm in diameter overall, with 14–15 white '**petals**', and yellow centres. Flower heads single or clustered, at the tops of the stems. Flowering: November–February
