Common name

A Daisy-bush

Family

Asteraceae

Where found

Open **forest** and rocky areas around riverbeds and gorges. Kosciuszko National Park, near Burrinjuck Reservoir, tablelands, and ranges.

Notes

Shrub to 1.6 m high. Branchlets hoary or silvery. Leaves **alternating** up the stems or opposite each other, scattered, 1.2–9 cm long, 1.5–3.5 mm wide, upper surface almost hairless, lower surface grey-**woolly**, margins rolled down, tips pointed and finely **mucronate**. Flower **heads** with 5–8 white '**petals**', and yellow centres. Flower heads 16–26 mm in diameter overall, in loose clusters at the tops of the stems. Flowering: October–December.
