# **Plants of South Eastern New South Wales**

# Common name

### **Family**

Pittosporaceae

#### Where found

Woodland and heath. Ranges and tablelands north of east of Goulburn. Coastal in the Sydney area and north towards Gosford.

# **Notes**

Sprawling **shrub** with **wiry** stems snaking through surrounding vegetation. New shoots moderately hairy. Leaves **alternating** along the stems, clustered towards the ends of the branches, 1–1.6 cm long, 1.5-2 mm wide, often appearing **linear** because of the thick rolled down margins, bases stem-clasping; tips with a prominent **mucro**. Flowers with 5, sometimes 6, **petals** each 4–5.5 mm long, white with a mauve tinge, mauve to purplish outside. Flowers in clusters of 4–8 flowers, on stalks to 3.5 mm long. Flowers mainly late spring.
