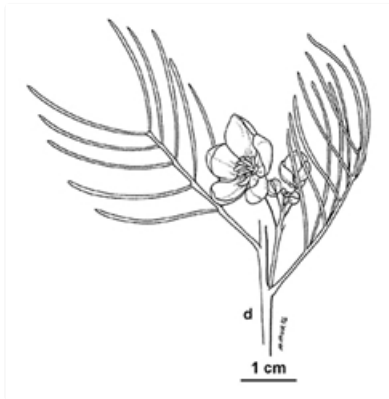


Plants of South Eastern New South Wales

Common name

Silver Cassia

Family

Fabaceae

Where found

Mallee, woodland, shrubland, and rocky ridges. Western Slopes.

Notes

Shrub to 3 m high, with an overall silvery appearance. Stems sparsely to densely hairy. Leaves 3–6 cm long including the leaf stalk 6–15 mm long, **alternating** up the stems, **compound**, with 6–16 leaflets each 1.5–2.5 cm long, about 1 mm in diameter. Leaflets cylindrical, channelled above, or flat to curved in cross section, margins rolled upwards, surfaces sparsely to densely hairy, 1–3 **glands** between the lowest leaflet pairs, leaflets spaced 6–10 mm apart. Flowers yellow, with 5 **petals** each 7–10 mm long. Flowers with 10 **stamens** that produce pollen. Flowers in 4–12 flowered clusters. Flowers winter-spring.

Endangered Vic.

Senna artemisioides subsp. *artemisioides* in Vic.

Family was Caesalpinaceae.
