

## Common name

Silver Cassia

#### Family

Fabaceae

# Where found

Mallee, woodland, shrubland, and rocky ridges. Western Slopes.

## Notes

Shrub to 3 m high, with an overall silvery appearance. Stems sparsely to densely hairy. Leaves 3-6 cm long including the leaf stalk 6-15 mm long, alternating up the stems, compound, with 6–16 leaflets each 1.5–2.5 cm long, about 1 mm in diameter,. Leaflets cylindrical, channelled above, or flat to curved in cross section, margins rolled upwards, surfaces sparsely to densely hairy, 1-3 glands between the lowest leaflet pairs, leaflets spaced 6-10 mm apart. Flowers yellow, with 5 petals each 7-10 mm long. Flowers with 10 stamens that produce pollen. Flowers in 4–12 flowered clusters. Flowers winter-spring.

Family was Caesalpiniaceae.
